### This Month in Butterflies

This month we will be looking at different types of transport.

This week we have been looking at construction vehicles, such as diggers and dumper trucks as the children have shown an interest in the builder's area outside.

We will then move on to activities around cars, buses, trains, planes and boats. The children will have the chance to play with small world toys and take part in craft activities.

We have also been able to get some double pushchairs and are looking forward to getting out and about to look at some real cars, buses and maybe some emergency vehicles.

### This Month in Bumble Bees

This week we have begun our theme of Journeys and Transport by looking at things that travel on the water. We have enjoyed having a pirate themed role-play area and making hats and telescopes.

We will be introducing our Garden Library on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> March (World Book Day). Reading and sharing stories is so vital for children's development. It will help their language, literacy and communication skills, as well as imagination and their social and emotional development.

Our Library Garden will be by the front door and all we ask is that you place any returned book in the box next to it, so they can be cleaned. Please swap books as often as you like.

Things to try at home.......

- Talk about how you get to places and talk about landmarks you pass on your way.
- •Count cars as you travel along the road. Try to talk about colours as well and count the number of red cars, for example.
- •Use any piece of paper or a cardboard box to draw numbered parking spaces on. You can then talk about numbers as you play with your child. You could write the numbers on the cars as well so it becomes a matching game.
